Georgia CORE Receives Funding Award from the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute



The Georgia Center for Oncology Research and Education (Georgia CORE), will receive an award from the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI) to support "Patient-Centered Cancer Survivorship Care: Improving Quality of Care and Quality of Life for Survivors in Georgia."

This Pipeline to Proposal project was developed collaboratively with Lanell Bellury, PhD, an expert in cancer survivorship and Associate Professor at Georgia Baptist College of Nursing of Mercer University. The award from PCORI will enable Georgia CORE to engage cancer survivors, healthcare providers and many other stakeholders in the process of developing research to address the needs of vulnerable cancer survivors in Georgia. "The on-going healthcare needs of cancer survivors, especially vulnerable older and minority survivors, are well recognized yet little evidence exists to guide the best care for survivors. With the number of cancer survivors growing exponentially, it is imperative that we discover the best way to meet the needs of survivors across the state," notes Dr. Bellury. Read [more](#).

Morehouse Professor Veena Rao, PhD, was recently recognized by the National Cancer Institute for her work in "Unraveling the Mysteries of BRCA1 in African American Women"

Morehouse School of Medicine Professor and Co-Director of the Cancer Biology Program and Georgia Cancer Coalition Distinguished Cancer Scholar in the Department of OB/GYN was recently recognized by the National Cancer Institute in a "Grantee Spotlight." Dr. Rao has spent the last 20 years investigating the inner workings of the BRCA1 gene. It has been linked to ovarian and breast cancer, including triple negative breast cancers that are more prevalent in African American women.

Rao was quoted as saying, "the primary function of the BRCA genes is to repair cell damage and keep breast cells growing normally. But when these genes contain abnormalities or mutations that are passed from generation to generation, the gene products do not function normally - and the risk for breast cancer increases substantially. But when an African American woman has triple negative breast cancer as a result of a mutation of BRCA1, this mutant protein stays in the cytoplasm and can develop into a tumor." Rao noted that if her work can help detect the cancer early, "We can break the disparity between African Americans and whites." Read [more](#).

While rare, breast cancer does affect women under the age of 45. Young women, however, may not realize they are at risk.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) new *Bring Your Brave* campaign, launched in May 2015, tells real stories about young women whose lives have been affected by breast cancer. These stories about prevention, risk, and survivorship bring to life the idea that young women can be personally affected by breast cancer. Through these testimonials, *Bring Your Brave* aims to inspire young women to learn their risk for breast cancer, initiate a dialogue with their health care provider about their risk, and live a breast healthy lifestyle.
