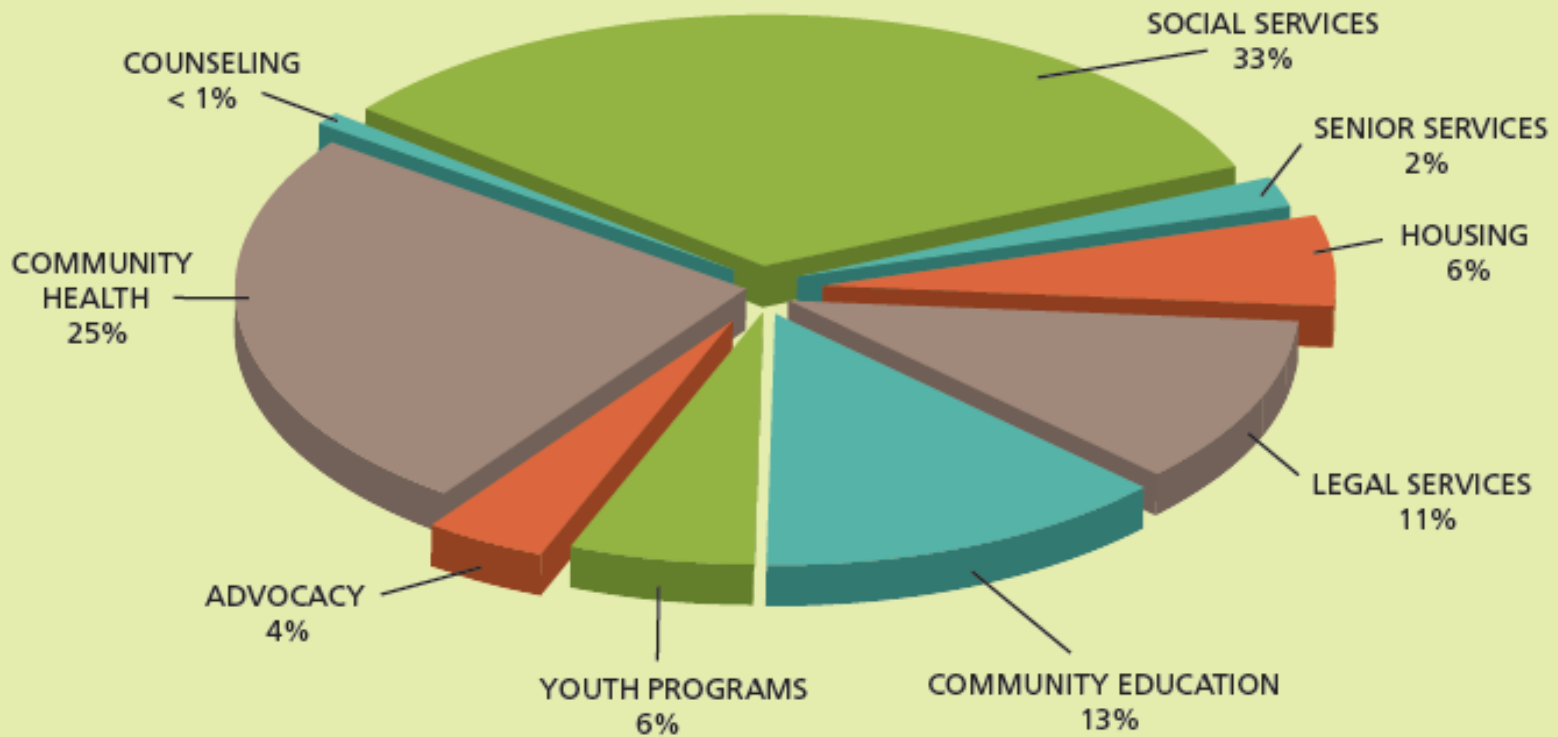

2,600 Clients served monthly



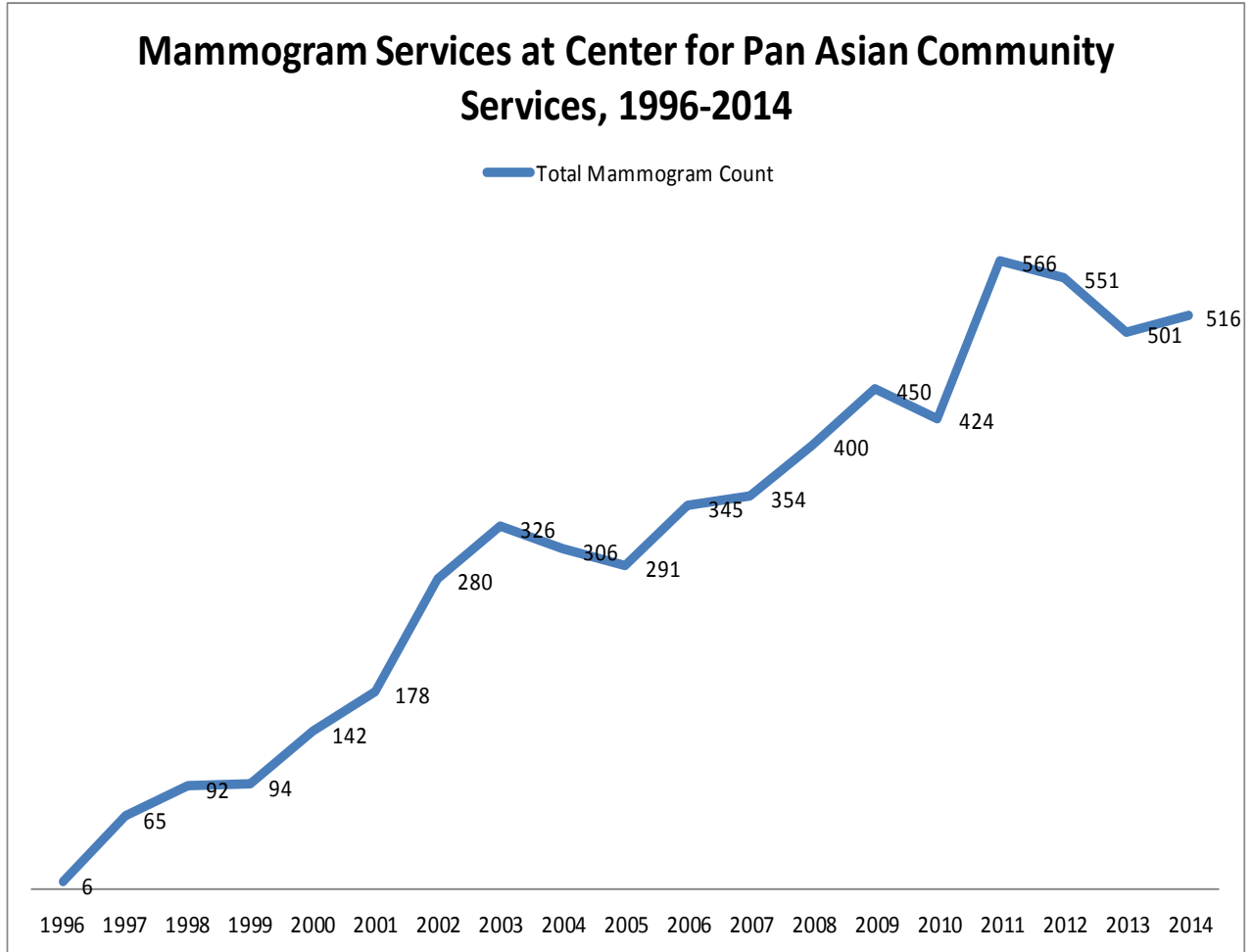
